<u>Next Steps:</u> When the Apostle Paul is helping Timothy choose the right leadership for the church in Ephesus, Paul gives these instructions for the overseers: "They must also have a good reputation with outsiders, so that they will not fall into disgrace and into the devil's trap." 1 Timothy 3:7

Not everyone aspires to be a leader in the church, but every Christian should aspire to have a good reputation with people outside the church. Our reputations are largely based on what we say and what we do. A good reputation is developed through saying and doing good things. We have 100% control over what we say and what we do.
